The Tasting Room with Vitasha

Wine Comparison—Pinot Grigio

pring is in the air, and we turn to thoughts of flowers blooming, cute little fuzzy animals, and picnics on the lawn with a glass of white wine. I don't often find a white wine that I like, but at a recent Kingdom Brewers Guild meeting, Master Timotheus Zacharia lead us in a tasting of Pinot Grigio.

In ancient times, the Pinot variety of grapes was grown in Gaul (present day France). In the first century AD, the Romans conquered Gaul and brought back the wine and vines and

began production of their own Pinot wines.

The wines we sampled were from Italy, Washington, California, and South Australia. The growing location will affect the flavor of the grapes, and

thus the wine. This taste variation can be attributed to the minerals present in the soil, the amount of precipitation in the region, the type of soil (clay retains water, whereas sandy soil lets the water run right through it), and the amount of sunlight the region receives.

The Pinot Grigio profile is slightly

sweet with citrus and floral notes. The alcohol, acids, and sugars in the wine should be well blended, and no one of those characteristics should stand out.

We ordered the wines from the driest to the sweetest as anticipated by the factors mentioned above. Here are the comments and evaluations of the wines we sampled.

Cavit Collection, Dell Venezie
2013 imported from Italy This
wine was somewhat dry, as expected from the region, yet fruity
with a floral or "green"

taste. It possessed some acidity and was a bit sour. It was commented that the flavor "Hits the sides of the tongue."

Beringer, California

2013 We found this wine to be sweeter that the Italian Pinot Grigio, and not quite as acidic. You could taste more of the grape. It was said that the ground comes through as a bit of a sand taste, or mineral taste, in this wine.

Oxford Landing Estates 2012 imported from South Australia

The flavor zipped straight down the middle of the tongue. The drier climate means less water which can skew the flavor. We found this wine to be more acidic that the Californian Pinot Grigio, and weaker in flavor.

Vino 2012 Mattawa from Washington Apple and earth scent sprang forth from this wine, and it involved the whole tongue. It had the expected acidity, but was complemented with tastes of lemon, apple, honey, and "green/earth". It was said to have almost a pine or floral—perhaps geranium—quality to the flavor.

All in all, the wines were drinkable and matched the Pinot Grigio profile, but the one that we found to be the most balanced and closest to the ideal was the Vino 2012 Mattawa from Washington.

So here's to relaxing on your patio on a balmy Caidan spring day with a glass of Pinot Grigio in hand. Cheers! **

Back in 2019, I learned how to net a bag from following along with Sally Pointer on her You-Tube video, "How to make a net bag for a Roman legionnaire" (Source)

Using kitchen cotton, I netted a bag body, then added a chain crochet edge and a lucet cord drawstring. Voilà, a

practical, useful shopping bag! (left)


Fast forward to June 2022, when a friend offers space in their madder dyepot. Maybe because it was kitchen cotton, and not mercerized (?), it took the dye beautifully (right).

I continued using the bag for a while in this configuration, rather like a modern string shopping bag. Much as I love the security of the drawstring, it was awkward to maneuver contents into the bag with such a loose and floppy mouth.

Earlier this month, I read some exciting new opinions on Viking bag handles, which WILDLY coincide with my own. (Source) So I put together the Viking bag handles I was gifted at Deck the Halls of Valhalla (Brokenbridge's inaugural event of the 2023 season) with the bag body, using some lucet cord I had previously made out of a hand-dyed linen from Ursula's Alcove. I threaded the original drawstring through the upper holes on the bag handle frames. (right)

Now, the bag opening has a frame that supports without restricting, and evenly distributes the weight of the bag contents for ease of carrying and storing, notably by hanging over 2 nails on a wall. (right)



Detail from the Armorial de Flandre et du Hainaut, by Jacques Le Boucq, illustrated in Belgium, 15th Century



Amazon...Frown? Amazon Smile Cancelled, Costing Non-Profits

ago, in Vol. 15 (published September 1, 2022), we published an article about the AmazonSmile program, which donated a portion (0.5%) of profits from eligible Amazon purchases to various non-profit organizations, including the SCA. To

that date, the SCA had made \$39,218.59 in donations this way.

However, according to a report from Lady

Angelica di Nova Lipa, Amazon has discontinued the program as of February 20, 2023. Citing the over 1 million participating organizations, they expressed concern that their support was "spread too thin" and felt that the program "has not grown to create the impact that [they] had originally

hoped". They also emphasized their other ongoing charitable efforts, such as Amazon Future Engineer and Amazon Disaster Relief, and encouraged participating non-profits to continue to "seek support from Amazon customers by creating their own wish lists." According to NPR, this cancellation comes along with a spate of other cost-cutting measures for the mega-corporation, including 18,000 layoffs at the beginning of this year.

It's worth noting that Angelica received this announcement by email on January 18, amounting to a month's notice before the cancellation of the program. The news was met with alarm on social media, especially from smaller non-profits who depended on the program far more than larger ones with other, more reliable sources of income.

What does this mean for you and the average SCAdian? It depends on how much you usually use Amazon. It is still the world's second-largest company by revenue, behind only Walmart (according to Wikipedia), and that's not particularly likely to change significantly anytime soon. As we stated in our Spetember 2022 article, it is still best practice to purchase items from your local small businesses and independent artisans. This was true then, and perhaps even more true now. They need and will appreciate your support more now than ever!

If you're looking for alternatives to Amazon, sites like Etsy, Bookshop. org, Overstock, and Newegg.com can serve in terms of product range and shipping times. Or, if you do find something you want to buy on Amazon, you can usually click on the seller and purchase the item directly from them. **


